


## 1-2-3 Socratic Discussion on: *In the Time of the Butterflies*

Today you will use turnitin.com to have a Socratic Discussion on the novel *In the Time of the Butterflies*. There are several steps that you will be asked to accomplish during this activity.

To start off:

- 1) Open Safari and navigate to turnitin.com.
- 2) Log in. (If you can't get in, select "retrieve my password", and follow the steps listed.)
- 3) Click on WLC BK 1 or 3 (depending on which block you are in)
- 4) Click on "Discussion":



Once the assignment's post date has passed, you will also be able to view the feedback left on your paper by clicking the "View" button.


Ex: TB1

To post, you should click on “post a new topic”, type in your question, and click submit.

To post a new discussion topic, enter a discussion topic title and a description. If you would like, you can modify the dates for this discussion topic. Your topic will be active during these dates. When a topic is active, students can post new messages. If you would like to assign a moderator, you can do so using the moderator pulldown. To make replies anonymous, select yes using the anonymous pulldown. Click submit to add the discussion topic to your class.
